# Barley to Beer

## The Amazone Training, Education & Research Facility – Orchard Farm, Hurst Lane, Auckley

Farming is all about finding markets for the food being grown. We need locally-sourced produce in the food chain so we rely less heavily on imported foods, the cost of which, due to unrest in the world, can soar and so home-grown food increases food security as well as keeping prices at a fair level. We at AMAZONE are always looking to introduce farming methods that can help protect the environment as well as providing food on the table.

Harvest 2023 saw a crop of spring barley being combined at Orchard Farm.

Spring barley, when grown properly to enable it to be used for malting, forms the ideal constituent of beer and we control the amount of



fertiliser applied to ensure the right nitrogen content in the grain so that the malting process can take place.

Clever fertiliser spreader technology reads a map via satellites telling it how much to apply and where to apply it so as to get the right quality of barley for that beer.

In 2023, in conjunction with Harper Adams University, we and a local farmer's son took part in a project here in Auckley to grow a sustainable barley crop. We have seen the effect that climate change is having on the weather with periods of drought followed by torrential rain which can run off the fields causing erosion if the soil structure is not capable of letting water infiltrate into the ground and help prevent flooding. The project looked at the effect of soil compaction on both yield and infiltration during differing cultivation techniques as well as looking at the level of CO<sub>2</sub> emitted by moving the soil.

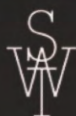

**Auckley Show support was a let down**

The attendance and number of entries were disappointing at Auckley Horticultural Show, according to the organisers.

Mr David Moore, who is secretary of Auckley and Branton Gardening Association, said about 200 people visited the show – "not a very good turn out."

**IMPRESSED**

"Last year we were struggling to get the goods into the tent," he said. "It wasn't big enough." This year, however, the exhibits were more sparsely arranged in the tent at the Auckley Side Saddle Country Club.

The trouble was, said Mr Moore, that usually the show is held as part of the Auckley Gala but this year it as a separate venture.

Despite the disappointments though, the quality of the potatoes impressed the judge enormously and Mr H. Brewster won best in show.

Other first prize winners were; **B Pearson** – carrots, runner beans and onions; **F. Binn** – onions over 8 oz and cabbage; **K Payner**– tomatoes and cucumber; **R. Perry** – most unusual vegetable a khol rabbi, looks like a turnip, tastes like a cabbage, said Mr Moore. Mrs O Brewster – gladioli; Mrs R Perry – dahlias; Mrs B Morris – plain fruit scones.

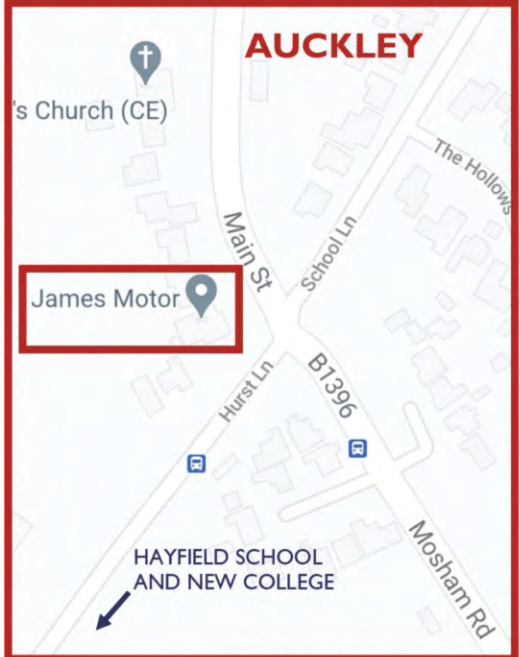

Reproduced here is a letter I sent to Auckley Parish Council dated 31<sup>st</sup> August 1985, I was at that time the Secretary of the then 'Auckley and Branton Garden and Allotments Association', now known as The Auckley Show. In 1985 saw the first Show on the current location.

I would like to thank Marjorie Cayghill of the Auckley Parish Council for preserving my letter and providing me a copy.

To the Parish Council,

31<sup>st</sup> August 1985

Auckley and Branton Garden and Allotments Association would like to thank the Parish Council for their support during this year's Annual Show. It was somewhat of an experiment holding the show on the playing fields, the biggest fear was that because of the isolated position we would not get as good an attendance. This was not so and it was bigger and better than ever, a total success which everyone enjoyed.

This year's best allotment winner was Mr Eric Newbound, the trophy was presented in the evening by Mrs Worthington.

There were two main expenses that was unforeseen when the show was planned.

1. Toilets. 218 people attended the dance at night, I would think at least three times that number during the day. The two toilets in the pavilion were used for the ladies. We hired two further toilets at a cost of £23.00.

2. Lighting, the Christmas tree lights were found in the pavilion, but no bulbs. We needed extra lights for the evening so we purchased 24 coloured and six white light bulbs, a cost of £26.84. I submit the two invoices to the Parish Council for consideration that they be met from council funds.

The dance at night produced rather a lot of noise. I would ask that the residents surrounding the playing fields be thanked for their patience and tolerance in the next newsletter. As far as I know not one complaint was received.

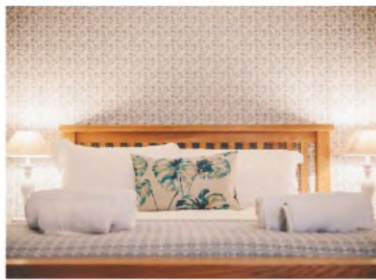

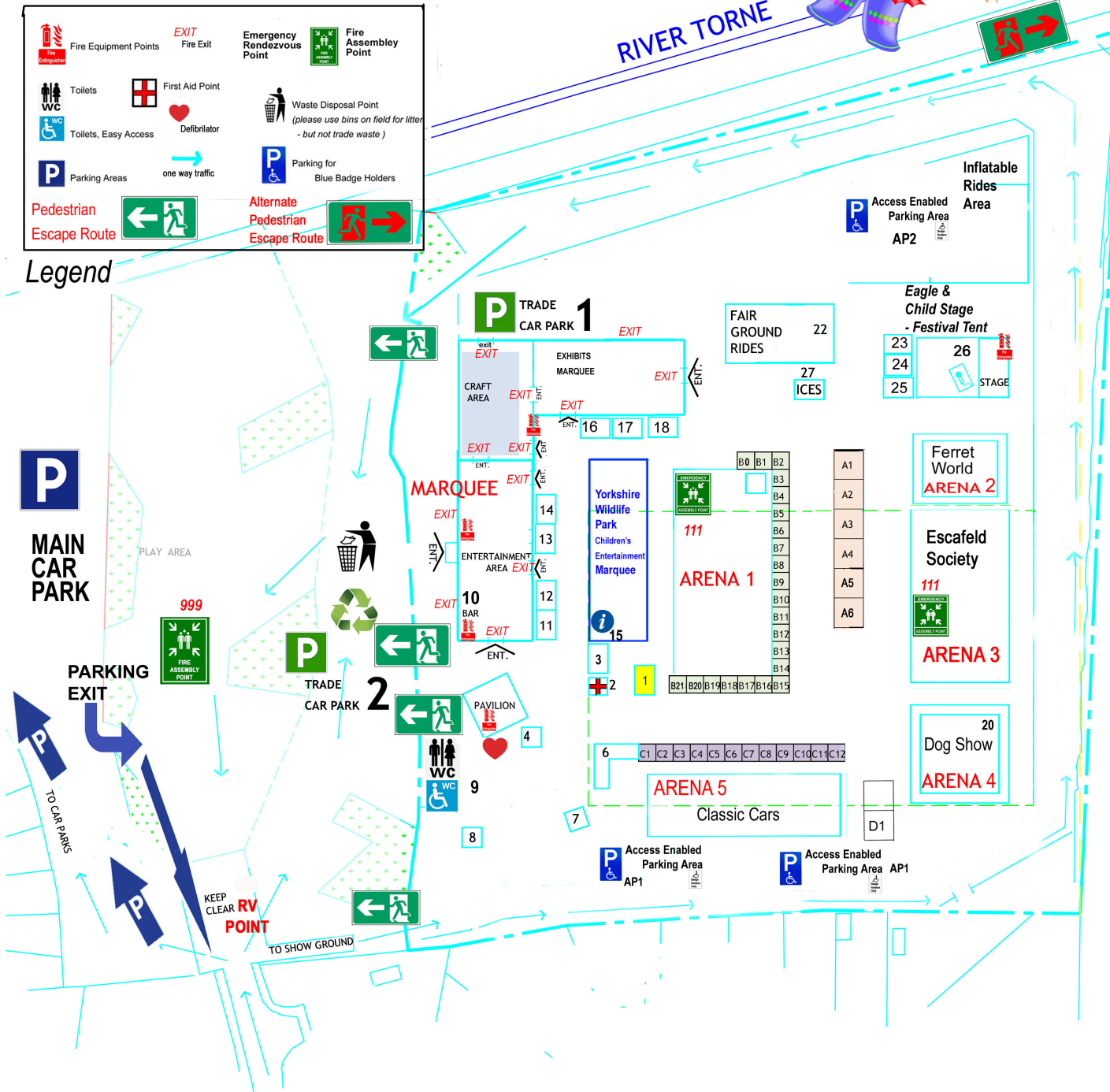

## Life in Auckley in Victorian days

When Victoria came to the throne in 1837, the population of the village was around three hundred and sixty. There were about ten local farms and they provided employment for the majority of the menfolk of the village. The work was hard: sixty to seventy hours a week, six days a week, working in all weathers for very little payment.

There was no such thing as unemployment benefit, sickness pay, paid holiday leave or even a pensionable old age to look forward to; in any case this was largely irrelevant, as life expectancy was around the forty/fifty year mark. In short, a worker laboured until he was physically no longer able to do so and then, if he was fortunate, was looked after by his family or otherwise became a pauper, possibly ending his days in the workhouse: in fact, about one third of those over the age of sixty-five were paupers.

At this time the village boasted two shops, two inns, a chapel and, from 1838, St Saviour's Church. The cottages were generally draughty, damp places. Water was drawn from the well, heating came from an open fire, whilst candles or kerosene provided light. Venturing out after nightfall was to do so in absolute darkness, apart from moonlight, and generally everything was very, very quiet, as most villagers would stay indoors during the hours of darkness.

The womenfolk had no household aids to assist them and although families tended to be

large in those days, it was a sad fact that one in four newly-born children died before reaching their first birthday. It wasn't as if those children who survived had an any easier life. By the age of around eleven the boys would be working in the fields, whilst the girls, after helping look after the younger ones in the family, quite often went into service around the age of thirteen, frequently moving to board with those by whom they were employed.

Matters did improve during the long reign of Queen Victoria: half day Saturday work became

the acceptable pattern; bank holidays were added in the early 1870s; and by 1903 a farm labourer could earn about fifty pounds a year. At that time, in pre decimal terms, beer at the local inn was then about two pence a pint and in 1888 Woodbine cigarettes cost one penny for five.

Auckley School opened its doors for the first time in the autumn of 1876 for children aged 5-10. Not everyone welcomed this event with open arms. Some villagers didn't regard the ability to read and write as being important; farmers were concerned that if boys were at school they wouldn't be available to provide inexpensive labour required at harvest time; and families wished to keep the children at home for the boys to support family coffers by their labours and the older girls to help look after the younger ones in the family.

(Cont.)When the school first opened, school attendance was neither compulsory nor free. Parents had to pay two pence a week for each child under ten and three pence for older ones and this, of course, wasn't an incentive for families struggling financially.

The Auckley School Board helped out where they could and made special arrangements with some families e.g. if the family would pay for three children, then a fourth child could attend free of charge. The need of the farmers for additional child labour at harvest time was accommodated by the Auckley Board adjusting the school holiday pattern when it was necessary.

Eventually, in 1880 school attendance became compulsory, but it was still not free. The average attendance each week was usually under 70%. Even in 1890, when it at last became free, attendance figures still remained low. It was to be a long time before matters improved. Those attending the school had no easy time. The learning concentrated on rote learning and reading, writing and arithmetic with much repetition in order to meet the requirements of the annual inspection on which much of the funding of the school was based. The visiting inspectors not only examined the registers (to judge attendance figures) but also tested each and every pupil to determine if the standard required of them had been met.

The school building itself wasn't welcoming: it had no inside lavatories; the playground was simply formed of packed earth ; water came from the school well and the open fires ( there were no fire-guards until the early 1900s) were only lit on the very coldest of days. The school log records on the 14<sup>th</sup> December 1899 "*Fires lit, so cold, children couldn't properly hold a pen or pencil*".

Perhaps the pupils longed for the holidays. These were not as they are today: there were no half term holidays (apart from a week at Whitsuntide for the Auckley Feast);Christmas was generally about one week, but there was no New Year's Day holiday and Easter barely extended beyond Good Friday and Easter Monday, whilst the summer holiday was usually in August and lasted about one month -but was subjected to variation caused by any harvesting needs. There was , however, a half day's holiday on the afternoon of Shrove Tuesday, when the pupils were provided with a tea at school and given presents of sweets, nuts and oranges and allowed in the afternoon to play out in a field.



There was also the enforced holiday (often up to a month in length)-one necessitated to combat outbreaks of various complaints: scarlet fever,

measles, whooping cough, mumps etc. One of the more feared outbreaks was diphtheria. The school log book entry of 24<sup>th</sup> February 1905; "*The course of the outbreak of the epidemic shows no sign of abatement. The first one attacked-Elsie Mason-an infant-was buried this afternoon. The scholars present showing their sympathy with the bereaved family by lining up and presenting a wreath of snowdrops and arum lilies as the cortege passed the school gate.*"

How things have changed.

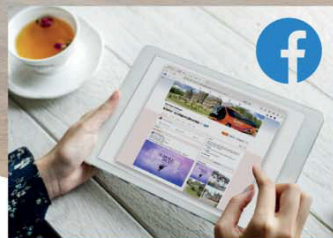

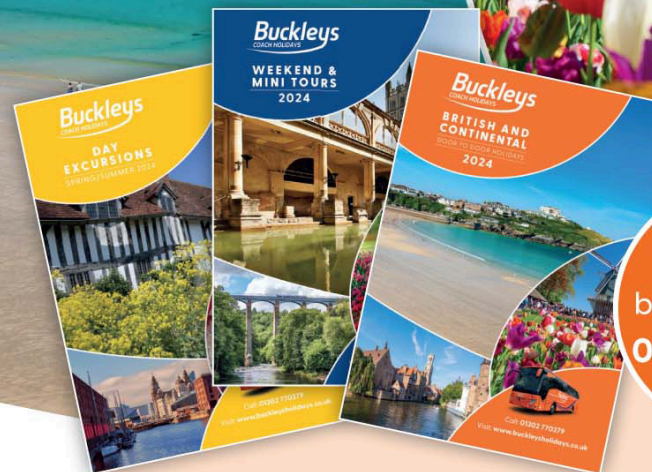

## A SENIOR AUCKLEY RESIDENT REMEMBERS -

### MYSELF WHEN YOUNG – Brian Townend Age 90

Last year just on my 90<sup>th</sup> birthday, I was invited to speak to the pupils at Auckley Junior School about my childhood, starting school and how things have changed. The chairman of Auckley show, Neil Woodward, subsequently approached me to prepare an item on the same subject for the show, so here goes.



I was born outside Wakefield in October 1933 in a village very similar to Auckley. At the age of five I started at the village school, called Hill Top. The school was about ten minutes walk from my home.

After my first year under Mrs Cockayne (Head Mistress) and Miss Wilson (the only other teacher), war was declared and normal country life was disrupted.

Many of my Mother and Father's family members were called up to serve King and country. Those excused were employed in vital jobs or not of a suitable age.

Not many families had cars, so we walked to school. In due course we were all issued with gas masks, which had to be carried at all times in a cardboard box strapped to our shoulders.

Later, the spare land opposite the school gate, was dug up and an air raid shelter was built and practice runs were done, supervised by the teachers, crossing the road and going down the steps into the unlit air raid shelter.

Lights in both streets and homes had to be shielded so as not to be visible from the air, and even torches were regulated. Before shelters were provided for our homes we used the cellar at home for protection. Sirens sounded to warn of incoming raids to tell everyone to take cover, be it day or night.

Our village had no military range, but being close to several industrial towns and cities was in danger from enemy bombers passing overhead. Anti aircraft guns were sited nearby and the spent shells resulted in shrapnel falling around us. This was often collected on the following morning by local boys as souvenirs.

There was of course no television in those days and so people relied on BBC radio reports of raids from the previous days and nights.

I moved on from Hill Top Junior to Westerton School, the Headmaster was Mr Ben Townend (no relation).

Similar safety rules applied with shelters and gas mask rules applying. If sirens sounded as we walked home across the fields we had to run as quickly as possible as we could see and hear the aircraft overhead.

When the war ended it was very strange to feel safe at last and not knowing what the future held for any of us.

#### *Foot note*

*After leaving school at the age of 18 years Brian joined the RAF where he completed National Service. With postings at Yeadon and training in Wales. With the RAF attended the Kings funeral and the Queen's coronation.*

*Brian moved to Auckley in the early 60's he recalls his daughters walking through the Orchard now Orchard Walk, to catch a bus to Rossington School. The Auckley Show was then held where the Spar supermarket is built on Ellers Lane. The highlight was the mixed adult wheelbarrow race, the ladies being the wheel. Would you enter if we brought it back? Sounds good fun for both competitors and spectators.*

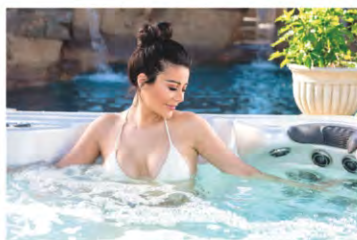

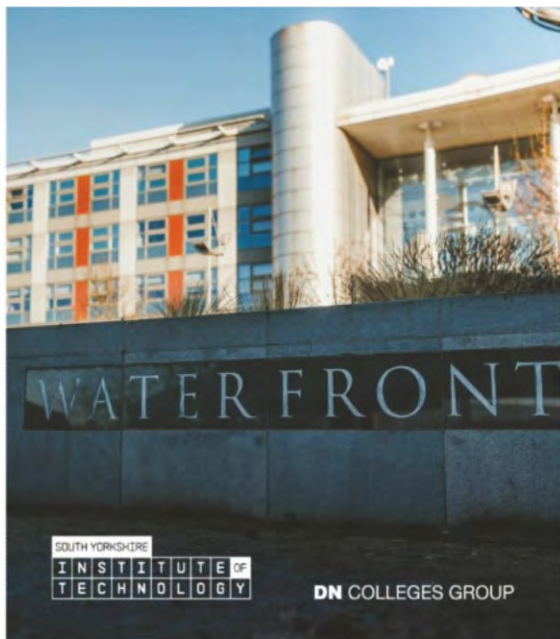

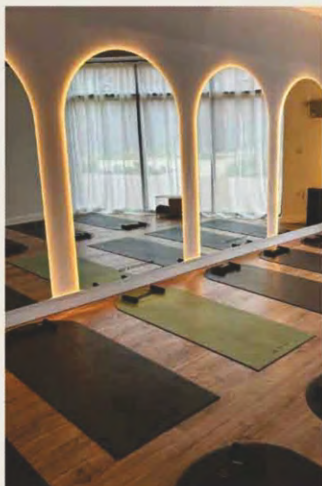

# Health and Safety at Auckley Show

**First Aid** - can be found near the YWP open sided marquee (*marked on our field plan*) or make contact with any Air Cadet personnel who have radio contact.

A **Defibrillator unit** is located on the outside wall of the Pavilion, facing toilet block.

**Lost Children and Property** – please report to the Air Cadet Command Tent near YWP marquee (*marked 1 on field plan*)

**Leaving and entering the Showground by car-** Entering the site and parking vehicles is entirely at the owner's own risk. Please follow the directions of our marshals, they are there to allow you to arrive and leave safely. Please pay attention to any instructions given to minimise the risk of accidents. There is a site wide speed limit of 5mph. Please obey the ONE WAY traffic directions and use extreme caution across the site.

**Pedestrians** please avoid the perimeter track used by vehicles. Remember this is a field site and the ground may be uneven in places.

**Families.** Please keep any young children under direct supervision. Please respect all safety barriers and take care in all parts of the site.

**Easy Access toilet** is provided next to the main toilet blocks.

**Baby Changing facilities** are within this unit

**NO SMOKING** areas include within all marquees and all car parking places.

**Serious Threat of Danger.** If an incident occurs that is considered a risk to visitors, announcements will be made by public address speakers and repeated by stewards and all visitors should move to the centre of the Main Arena or Arena 2 as directed by stewards. If it becomes necessary to then evacuate the site instructions will be given as to which route to take. All persons must leave on foot. Vehicles must not be moved. Do not return to cars until it has been announced safe to do so. Be aware that police and rescue vehicles may need to enter the site through the main entrance. Keep the trackway clear.

**Field Plan.** A site plan is included in our programme and is available at our information desk. This shows the location of safety equipment and services. Also marked are fire exits and escape routes.

If you have any concerns or questions please let us know at our information desk. If urgent ask any marshal or steward, identifiable by blue Auckley Show shirt, high-viz jacket or cadet uniform, for assistance to communicate to our control centre.
